A magnificent turnout has been had at The Little this month, with many bums on seats, which is great to see as buying habits seemed to have changed quite a bit since the pandemic. It used to be that many tickets would be bought well in



advance but now, buyers are more likely to purchase tickets the week before or of the show. This can cause quite a bit of stress for production teams, so it's been hugely positive to see great audiences throughout the season so far.

Black comedy Entertaining Mr Sloane was our in-house production this month, shining a spotlight on the work of Leicester's own Joe Orton. And The Little Theatre saw its secondbiggest audience of the season when KPAOS brought 9 to 5 the Musical to the stage in November (behind only Black Coffee). As a committee member of the society, I can tell you it was greatly appreciated to feel so included in all The Little Theatre's marketing. And, as Judy Bernly was my first lead role, I will never forget this experience. Thank you to everyone who made KPAOS feel very



much at home during dress and tech rehearsals and show week.

Excitingly, but unsurprisingly, panto is close to selling out with only 12% of tickets left. It has a stellar cast and rehearsals are looking fab! Get your tickets while you still can – best availability is after Christmas.

Keep an eye out for our spring/ summer 2023 brochure, which will be released this month, and get booking tickets for our upcoming shows.

Trustees' Board Report

The Trustees met in both October and November, so this summary covers both meetings since Scene's last issue.

Ticket sales

Jenny Harding (Treasurer) reported that whilst we were not reaching the target number of seats sold for each LDS play, current-year sales are higher than the lowest capacities last year (when we were coming out of lockdown), which was a good sign of recovery. Jenny also noted that the annual audit of our financial statements had commenced in November. The Board has agreed to a recommended rise in seat ticket prices by £1 for the 2023-24 panto, Puss in Boots. Even with this rise, it will still make our seats cheaper than any other Christmas show in Leicestershire.

Little Theatre Guild

Mary Jones (Honorary Secretary) reported very good feedback from the delegates attending the Little Theatre Guild (LTG) annual conference which we hosted in October. Delegates had travelled from all over England. Curve kindly gave the conference a backstage tour of their theatre, with the host telling us there could be opportunities to share their facilities and that they would like to work closer together with us. Mary noted that LTG delegates experienced a lively improv session led by Tom Young, had a lovely meal hosted by our sponsor Café Roma, and closed the day seeing the final performance of Alphabetical Order, after which they commented on how wonderful the acting and set was.

Brand awareness

Tom Young (Marketing and Outreach) was pleased to report an increase in our social media reach, which has increased six-fold, meaning 180k people are now seeing each of our posts and hearing about our theatre. On certain productions, this has led to an increase in ticket sales of up to 20% of capacity during show week. The brochure for our spring/summer season was recently sent to the printers and will be available soon. He reported some challenges with the low numbers attending the acting workshop recently, (which is run as improvised comedy and theatre training) and wanted to encourage others to join the group - this is in the studio on Thursday evenings (7pm-10pm) and free to members. He worked on sound and lighting for school productions: on one of these, the reel-to-reel tape machine developed a fault and Andy had to spread its tape out all over the floor and feed it in to avoid stopping the show! His efforts were appreciated by one of his teachers, who happened to be Head of Sound at The Little, and Andy was invited to run sound for his first production here.

Andy also tried his hand at lighting in his early days, and that's where his passion has been ever since. He has designed for many plays, pantos, musicals and specials over the intervening years, with many great memories of these productions and the people who were part of them. He has name-dropped some current comedy stars who appeared on

our stage before they were famous: Michael McIntyre, Chris Addison, and Rob Beckett.

Away from the theatre, Andy's day job is as an independent funeral celebrant, conducting Celebration of Life services. Andy has two sons – his eldest, Alex, also works backstage at the theatre. ObituarySusan Vials

May 18, 1944 - November 10, 2022

LDS members and friends will be greatly saddened to learn of the death of Sue Vials on Thursday, November 10.

Sue had already been in charge of props on a number of productions for Ratae Co-operative Players by the time she joined the props team at The Little for *Much Ado About Nothing* in 2004. For the next fifteen years or so, until the pandemic-enforced closure of the theatre, Sue worked on props for over thirty plays, including leading the props team for eight pantomimes. Everyone involved in those productions will recall her detailed lists, creativity, thoughtfulness, sense of humour and calm, professional approach, both in the rehearsal room and during show week. Every actor felt supported, knowing that props would always be in the right place at the right time... and that props should be *returned* to the right place, too!

Apart from props, Sue was Programme Editor for three dozen or more productions, typed up the pantomime scripts, and could always be relied on to fulfil any proofreading requests. She was a hugely efficient Chair of the marketing team, overseeing many aspects of the work that team does, including ensuring that the LDS brochure was prepared on time.

The last major project in which Sue was involved was the creation of the book to mark the centenary of the



Leicester Drama Society, *In Our Time*. She was part of the small editorial team, which, for almost four years, met every second week to trawl through the archives, read countless sets of minutes and plan the structure of the book. As it took shape, Sue's proofreading skills were put to very good use. On January 28 of this year, Sue was at the theatre for the Centenary Book launch, working – as always – to ensure the success of the evening.

Although we think of Sue at this particular time, we know that her husband Ron was there working alongside her at The Little Theatre. Together, they formed a wonderful team and we are hugely grateful for the contribution they have made to the life of Leicester Drama Society.

Sue's funeral will be held at 11:30am on Thursday, December 8 at Great Glen Crematorium, LE8 9DJ. Adam & Mary Jones



Thank you so much for such a great day yesterday. It had all the elements that add up to a good conference and you both worked so hard to make it all happen.

I was very impressed with the way you keep your building spick and span, with everything in its place. It is seriously impressive. I love your production photos. You have a very talented photographer in your midst.

Anne-Marie Greene is a great speaker, I'm sure you'll agree. Everyone I spoke to said she'd make them think deeper, and they will have more conversations on the subject back at their own theatres.

The Curve is a fabulous building, and it was extraspecial for me to be able to catch-up with Chris Stafford, who I worked with at Shakespeare's Globe. Julia Thomas was a great guide; I heard her say at the end that she wanted to come and see your theatre, so do follow that up and invite her! I know professional theatres have a history of being stand-offish with amateurs, and I'm sure The Curve is the same – but knowing Julia might be a way in and at the very least she should know more about you. She said The Curve is very good at encouraging projects; you never know she may think of something she could initiate with you.

It's the first time we've run the AGM and Open Forum over lunch, and I think it worked well and made for a more relaxed atmosphere. We might well repeat that. It helped a lot that your spread was easy to manage. No tricky dips!

Sharon Clement did a great job, especially as some of us are not au fait with social media, but we need to be, as it is, as she said, the future. No point in moaning that we don't get enough young people in our theatres if we don't engage with their world!

How lucky we were to have a lovely autumn afternoon to walk to the Richard III Centre, and it is very good indeed. I could easily have had a tea there and stayed for much longer.

I managed to catch the last of Tom Young's workshop – it was obviously great fun as we could hear the peals of laughter from outside! Do pass on our thanks to him.

The play was excellent – I always find it fascinating to look back at times I've lived through, and Paul Beasley's programme notes were so interesting. I have to say, I did feel for the props person, then saw that it was a team of three – I hope they shared the load each night after curtain down, and then – of course – the careful stuffing afterwards.

Name: John Bale

Age: 61

Profession: Head of Wardrobe and Costume Design for LDS

Upcoming production: Aladdin

Noteworthy Productions: I have been working as head of wardrobe and costume design at the LDS for just over 20 years (with a little break in 2020 because of you know what).

What was the first theatre show you saw?

When I was at school in the '70s, I was taken to the old Phoenix Theatre (now the Sue Townsend Theatre) to see a production of *Toad of Toad Hall*. From that moment, I was mesmerised. I can still remember the smell and the audience reactions. "The smell of the greasepaint and the roar of the crowd".

What was the first theatre show you were in?

I didn't appear on the stage until I was 17 (other than school productions, notably as a robot, a Christmas cracker, and an evil queen! Good to see that some things don't change!). This was in a local panto in Countesthorpe as Idle Jack in *Dick Whittington*. Of course, it was!

What's your favourite role you've played to date?

Anyone who knows me will know the answer to that one... Panto Dame, all the way. However, I have been lucky enough to play some fantastic roles with the LDS over the past 30 years. My favourites being C.S Lewis in Shadowlands and Osborn in Journey's End. Both very serious roles to counterbalance the panto mayhem.

What's your dream role that you're yet to play?

Alas, it's passed me by... but I've always wanted to play Professor Higgins in the musical, My Fair Lady.

What's the best theatre show you've ever seen?

I saw a professional production of *The King's Speech* on tour at the Theatre Royal in Nottingham a few years ago, and that blew my mind. And the London version of *Billy Elliot* is up there too.

What's your favourite thing about The Little Theatre?


Striving for the best we can achieve in all departments. That wonderful feeling when you know you're on to something good... Most of the people here aren't too bad either!
